Feature Film, ANGELIQUE'S ISLE TO FILM IN TERRACE BAY on MARCH 1, 2 AND 3.

THUNDER BAY, ON (February 24, 2017) – With just under one week left before Angelique's Isle begins filming the winter portion of the project, crew is busy preparing. Based out of Thunder Bay, crew from across Ontario and Nova Scotia have come together to tell a riveting and emotional story.

Based on a true story, Angelique's Isle is one of the most harrowing tales of perseverance and survival to ever be recorded on the infamously beautiful and unforgiving Lake Superior. During the copper rush of 1845, Angelique Mott and her husband Charlie get left for dead on a deserted island by a corrupt copper hunter named Cyrus Mendenhall. A young Anishinaabe woman of seventeen, newly married Angelique must struggle to survive the harsh winter, as Charlie succumbs to the power of the Windigo, the cannibal spirit. Angelique must heed the messages sent by her shaman grandmother via dreams and animals in order to survive. This film is a heroine's emotional journey based in the realm of historical fact. Angelique must confront loss, betrayal, temptation and physical suffering while struggling to make the connection to her true identity and the spirit world that will save her life, all while coming of age.

For three days, cast and crew will descend on Terrace Bay, and the stunning shore of Lake Superior. Beginning Saturday, February 25 access to trails in and around Pumphouse and Kevin's Beaches, including parts of Pumphouse Beach road, will be closed in order to preserve the blanket of snow and scenery in the area where filming will take place. Residents and tourists are asked to please respect these restrictions and can resume access on Saturday March 4, 2017.

The production is looking for drivers with snow machines and/or quads to join the team while in Terrace Bay. Also, they seek RV's for rental for the filming days.
