TESLA SUPERCHARGER IS NOW OPEN FOR PUBLIC USE

The world's fastest electric vehicle charging network – TESLA supercharger has been strategically installed in Terrace Bay to provide services for locals and Highway 17 drivers. The Township has been in contact and working with TESLA since September 2017 to realize this mutually beneficial partnership that holds vast potential in attracting commuters into our welcoming community.

AGUASABON SURGE TANK REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Yet another environment-friendly project is underway by the Ontario Power Generation (OPG) for renewable and clean energy sourced from hydroelectric power. In the first quarter of 2020, an open house in Terrace Bay will be held to present the Aguasabon Surge Tank Replacement Project to the public. It is scheduled to be ready for operation by the end of 2020.



TERRACE BAY – MARATHON PARTNERSHIP FOR HIGH SPEED INTERNET

The Marathon/Terrace Bay Fibre-to-the-Home Internet Community Expansion Project is being proposed with the expected total cost of \$8,451,860, out of which 50 per cent is requested from NOHFC funding. Fibre-to-the-premise (FTTP) would improve the service options available for businesses and consumers in combination with providing increased network reliability. FTTP would also provide a “future proof” access infrastructure that can easily and cost effectively scale to meet future speed demand. Should this project be approved, it will enhance economic development potential by making Terrace Bay more attractive for residential and business relocation.

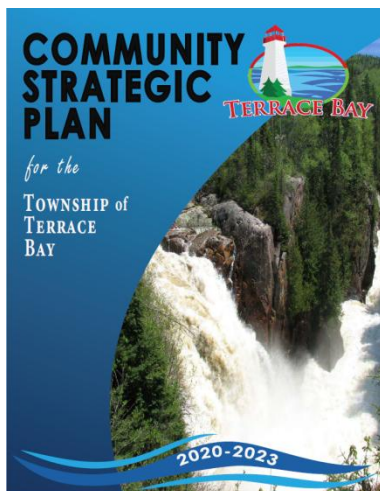
BRAND NEW WAYFINDING SIGNAGE IN TERRACE BAY



The bilingual community wayfinding signage project has been completed through a mutual partnership with Destination Northern Ontario (DNO), matching community contribution and FedNor. Funding allowed for the upgrades of the Aguasabon Gorge Entranceway and Terrace Bay Beach Signs. A completely new sign for the Aguasabon Golf Course has also been designed and built through this partnership. This project is one of many efforts for the town to attract more tourists from off the highway as well as to take another step forward in community beautification as outlined in

Terrace Bay's strategic plan.

KENOGAMI ROAD PHASE-I IS COMPLETE



Phase I of the Kenogami Road Reconstruction Project has been completed in October 2019 and the Township is currently working on procuring funding for Phase II of the project, which serves to fully mitigate the concerns regarding stormwater conveyance and condition of existing infrastructure. Having successfully accomplished Phase I, the Township is highly optimistic in the ability to secure funding and finish the second Phase in the near future.

NEW SKI CHALET BUILDING AT TRESTLE RIDGE SKI HILL



As a result of the Township and Terrace Bay Ski Club's cooperative work, a new portable trailer has been installed on the Trestle Ridge Ski Hill in November 2019.
