Charlie started his minor hockey career in Terrace Bay.

Years Played: MJHL 1971-1973, OHL 1973-1974, NHL 1974-1988

While with the LA Kings, Simmer played left wing on the “Triple Crown Line” with Marcel Dionne and Dave Taylor, one of the most potent and famed forward lines of the era. Despite injuries costing him significant playing time, Simmer had back-to-back 56 goal seasons and was further named an NHL First Team All-Star in 1980 and 1981. In the latter season, Simmer almost accomplished one of hockey’s most difficult feats: scoring 50 goals in 50 games, with 50 in 51 games. Simmer’s shooting percentage of 32.75 in 1981 was, and remains, an NHL Record.
