



HALEY IRWIN

Haley Irwin started playing Minor Hockey in Terrace Bay. She played boy's hockey until she was 16 years old and became the first girl ever to play boy's AAA hockey in Thunder Bay, Ontario.

Since 2007, Haley Irwin has been a member of Canada's National Women's Team. After competing with the national under-22 team, she made her world championship debut in 2009, helping the team win silver. She then went on to make her Olympic debut as part of the gold medal-winning squad at Vancouver 2010 and capturing two more world silver medals to go with a world title in 2012. She won her second Olympic gold medal at Sochi 2014.

Irwin played her collegiate hockey at the University of Minnesota-Duluth. As a freshman in 2007-08, she led all NCAA first-years in points per game and named 2007-08 WCHA Rookie of the Year. She also helped her team win the NCAA national championship, scoring the championship-winning goal against Wisconsin. After graduation she was drafted by the Montreal Stars of the CWHL and helped the team reach the Clarkson Cup final in 2012-13.
